Attention: Do-it-yourselfers and building industry professionals. If you are about to undertake a home or office improvement project, and need DIY books to guide you or tools to make it happen, don't rush out to buy those things on your own.

Check out the FREE Resource and Tool Lending Library inside our [Energy Innovation Center](#) located in the Clairemont area of San Diego.

Our library offers more than 1,500 books, DVDs, CD-ROMs, and diagnostic and measuring tools for checkout, such as wall scanners, leak detectors and airflow meters. Books range from technical handbooks on heating, ventilation, and air conditioning to sustainability-themed titles, such as "The Adventure of an Aluminum Can" and "Bird on Fire: Lessons from the World's Least Sustainable City."

Check-Out is Easy

Our [entire inventory](#) is available for browsing and search online – similar to how the public library online catalog works. From the comfort of your home, you can see the availability of our items. If you create an [account](#), you can reserve items online and come pick it up at your convenience.

The library is open Monday through Friday, 8 a.m.-5 p.m., 4760 Clairemont Mesa Blvd.

DayTripper Tours was founded in 1987 by then-tour bus driver Myron Stam under the name Hollywood Connection. It began as a one-person, home-based startup operation offering occasional one-day excursions to the Price is Right TV Show and other Hollywood game show tapings.

In 1989 the company name was changed to DayTripper Tours and its operations were expanded to include a myriad of other destinations throughout the Southwest and Mexico in response to increased demand for more tours. In 2011 the company was incorporated under the parent company Daycation Getaways, Inc., and that same year moved it's headquarters to the present location at 624 El Cajon Blvd., El Cajon, CA. The half-acre property provides both short and long term passenger parking as well as a 5,600 square-foot building that includes a passenger waiting lounge area and a small cafe for refreshments. DayTripper Tours has grown to become the largest tour operator of its kind in San Diego County and each year offers hundreds of day trips and multiple-day excursions outbound from San Diego to destinations throughout California, the Southwest, and beyond.

A GUIDE TO HELP YOU SURVIVE FIRES, FLOODS, EARTHQUAKES & MORE

July's wildfires are a poignant reminder that we all need to have our personal emergency preparedness plan in place, so we know exactly what to do in the event of an evacuation.

If you are wondering how to get your family ready, check out the San Diego Union-Tribune's "Are You Ready?" guide. Published this past weekend as a supplement in the Sunday newspaper, the guide is available [online](#).

The 32-page supplement is filled with helpful graphics and tips. Resources featured in the guide include:

- Smart phone apps to download for up-to-date information on disasters
- Checklist of essentials to stock to survive for up to three days
- Books to read to understand risks and prepare
- Key facts on earthquake, flood and fire insurance

Wildfire Threat

In addition, the guide includes maps that show the wildfire threat levels in our region and throughout California. Nearly our entire region is covered in varying shades of yellow, orange and red that indicate moderate, high, very high, and extreme fire risk.

Whereas in the past, only certain months of the year fell into the fire season, Californians now face wildfire threat year-round. With changes in climate conditions, record wildfires have erupted throughout California in recent years.

At SDG&E, we have implemented industry-leading programs and technologies to monitor and mitigate fire risk, including installing live-streaming cameras on mountain tops to enable early fire detection.

Our wildfire preparedness capabilities, including our weather center and camera network, are featured in an [article](#) on the back page of the Union-Tribune's guide.

I am a "Senager"


- ❖ I changed my car horn to gunshot sounds. People get out of the way much faster now.
